Vacancies: The eligible list resulting from this exam will be used to fill vacancies and all future vacancies as they occur in the Allegany County Sheriffs Department.

Candidates must have been legal residents of Allegany County and adjoining counties (Wyoming, Livingston, Steuben, Cattaraugus, McKean, and Potter Counties) for at least one month immediately preceding the date of the written examination. Preference may be given to residents of Allegany County or a political subdivision of Allegany County.

An official application form must be filed for each examination. You are responsible for completing all sections of the application. Exam number and title must be recorded on the application. INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS MAY BE DISAPPROVED. ATTENTION CROSS-FILERS:

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENT:

-If you have applied for both State and Local government examinations, you must take your examinations at the State examination center. You are required to notify the Allegany County Civil Service Office no later than two weeks before the test date by submitting a Cross Filing Form. You will be advised by letter when and where to report for your examinations.

-If you have applied for other Local government exams, you may select which location to appear for the exams. You are required to notify the Allegany County Civil Service Office no later than two weeks before the test date by submitting a Cross Filing Form. You must also notify all local government civil service agencies with whom you have filed an application of the test site at which you wish to take your exams.

Promotional Qualifications: Two years of full-time permanent competitive class service as a Correction Officer with the Allegany County Sheriff's Office.

DUTIES:

The work involves responsibility for overseeing and participating in a variety of duties in connection with the safety and efficient operation of the County Jail. An incumbent guards and attends to the care, well-being and discipline of jail inmates during assigned shifts. Supervision is received from a higher-ranking Sheriff's Department employee. General supervision is exercised over Correction Officers and Deputy Sheriffs assigned to work with the incumbent. A Correction Sergeant does related work as required.

Subjects of examination:

Preparing written material

These questions test for the ability to present information clearly and accurately, and to organize paragraphs logically and comprehensibly. For some questions, you will be given information in two or three sentences followed by four restatements of the information. You must then choose the best version. For other questions, you will be given paragraphs with their sentences out of order. You must then choose, from four suggestions, the best order for the sentences.

New York State minimum standards for correctional facilities

These questions test for knowledge of the Minimum Standards for state, county, and local correctional facilities that are promulgated by the New York State Commission of Correction in areas such as the admission/discharge, care, custody, movement, correctional treatment, security, supervision, and discipline of all persons confined in these systems.

Coordinating Appropriate Responses to Emergencies, Disturbances, and Other Unusual Situations

These questions test for knowledge in such areas as: anticipating possible correctional emergency situations, responding to situations promptly and allocating staff where needed; notifying supervisors of situations when appropriate; acting within rules to alleviate problems as quickly as possible with minimum use of force; investigating the causes of incidents; submitting reports on incidents.

Supervising Inmate Correctional Programs, Services, Visitation Areas, and Correctional Staff

These questions test for knowledge in such areas as: coordinating programs with civilian staff; ensuring that all employees relate well to visitors and guests and answer their questions in accordance with facility rules; organizing and supervising special programs involving outside groups (e.g., Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, etc.) and ensuring full cooperation from employees. The questions may also deal with such areas as: understanding new concepts and developments in the field of Corrections, and evaluating employees' capabilities and limitations on the job.

Test guide:

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication 'General Guide to Written Tests' helpful in preparing for this test. SENIORITY CREDITS: Points will be added to an eligible score as follows:

Seniority* - - - - - for each year - 0.2 credits.

*Rating of seniority is based on the length of continuous competitive class service up to a maximum of 20 years.

This written exam is being prepared and rated by the NYS Dept. of Civil Service in accordance with Section 23-2 of the Civil Service Law. The provisions of the NYS Civil Service Rules and Regulations dealing with the rating of exams will apply to this examination.

Religious Observers – Disabled Persons: If special arrangements for testing are required, please indicate this on your application form.

VETERANS OR DISABLED VETERANS desiring to claim additional credit may make application for such additional credit on their application for examination or at any time between the date of the application and the date of the establishment of the resulting eligible list. Veterans credit is added only to the score of the exam when the passing grade of 70 or higher is attained by the candidate.

ADDITIONAL EXAMINATION CREDIT TO CHILDREN OF FIREFIGHTERS AND POLICE OFFICERS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY - In conformance with section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duty shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of a firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duty in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.

Use of a calculator is ALLOWED. Candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, solar or battery powered calculators. **You will not be permitted to use the calculator function of your cell phone or smart watch.**
